To: Joint Review Panel on Lower Churchill Energy Development

On behalf of NunatuKavut Community Council and President Chris Montague, I would like to highlight as an Alternative Energy Project for consideration in Labrador the Ventus / NCC Height of Land Wind Park which would see 1000 megawatts of Wind Green Power developed and Aboriginal Partnership Participation plus availability of independent private financing.

Project was registered with Provincial Department of Environment in 2005 – 2006 for consideration through the Environmental Assessment Process and the full documentation should be available through Provincial Department of Environment.

Also NCC/Ventus Height of Land Wind Power project was registered with Crown Lands under application number 128366 and letter of response filed from Province on Feb. 22, 2006.

The project total financing was estimated at \$2.4 Billion and would have been a competitive power cost development for the province.

On March 10, 2006, both the Premier of Newfoundland and Labrador and Minister of Environment were written requesting a meeting to discuss the Wind Power development for Height of Land, Labrador.

Also a recent article Jan. 9, 2011 in Globe and Mail highlighted BC Hydro Utility deal with St'at'inc Aboriginal people for a \$200 million contribution for compensation for BC Hydro not providing electricity through grid to coastal Aboriginal communities. This article highlights a similar circumstance in Labrador for coastal Aboriginal communities of the South Coast.
