Mr. O'Brien:

BPLP is in receipt of the Company's letter dated 20-May-2017 regarding the Company's declaration of an occurrence of Force Majeure.

Missing from the Company's May 20, 2017 Force Majeure Declaration is any explanation or justification as to why the gate blockade constitutes a Force Majeure event. The gate blockade does not constitute a Force Majeure event as set forth in Article 28.

The blockade was formed as the protesters believed that the Company's recent release of water or failure to properly manage the downstream flows resulted in flooding of the Mud Lake community. Section 28.2 only allows the Company to claim a Force Majeure event if such event is "beyond the control and without the fault or negligence of [the Company], and which by the exercise of reasonable diligence [the Company] is unable to provide against it."

The blockade is the result of the Company release of water or failure to properly manage the downstream flows which resulted in the flooding of the Mud Lake community. This was clearly within the Company's control and the result of the Company's fault or negligence. Further, the Company, by exercising reasonable diligence, could have prevented the blockade by properly managing the downstream flows.

As such, BPLP is currently evaluating cost and schedule impacts and will notify MFC separately of these, if any.
