Summary:

The Nunatsiavut Government (NG) met with the Premier on Monday, September 26 regarding their concern with methylmercury associated with the Muskrat Falls project.

Key messages:

- We met with President Lampe and Minister Darryl Shiwak of the Nunatsiavut Government regarding their concerns relating to methylmercury on September 26th.
- It was a productive meeting and I feel we made progress.
- · We agreed:
 - To immediately establish a water quality monitoring program to provide a better understanding of the potential impacts as the initial phase of flooding begins. Consultation with the NG on the design of this program is underway;
 - To further discuss a role for the NG in monitoring, including the potential for an Independent Expert Advisory Committee on which they would participate; and,
 - To further discuss the NG's requests for an Impact Management Agreement and for joint decision-making authority over downstream environmental monitoring.
- Our government inherited the Muskrat Falls project. Given the contractual and legal obligations, we must proceed with the project and the initial flooding of the reservoir to 25 meters, which is anticipated to begin after October 15.
- We indicated that we are open to further examining the feasibility of clearing the reservoir from the 25 to 39 meter mark.
- Our government recognizes and appreciates the concerns of Aboriginal organizations. We look forward to continuing to work with them on this important matter.

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
