

MC2019-

- New Oversight Committee to be formed to implement recommendations on community-based monitoring and health management
- Discussion to begin on benchmarks and triggers related to an Impact Security Fund by Committee in context of monitoring data and health management; GNL previously directed compensation if consumption advisories needed.

 Direct Nalcor to perform soil capping as agreed to by all voting members of the IEAC; combine with fish habitat work

Soil Capping

- Direction communicated to Nalcor on February 11
- Nalcor indicated soil capping not possible this close to impoundment
- Permit requested July 2018 for Fish Habitat work not approved by MAE within window (prior to December 2018) for work
- MAE decision linked to IEAC recommendations and process was still ongoing
- Nalcor asked to consider capping after impoundment per SNC-Lavalin feasibility study presented to IEAC
- SNC-Lavalin advised there were safety issues due to instability of reservoir banks



Community Fund

- Wetland capping (on scale suggested by IEAC) predicted to reduce methylmercury by 1-2%
- Nalcor had notionally earmarked \$30M for wetland capping
- Nalcor has indicated a small amount of capping can potentially be completed before impoundment
- Nalcor also suggested that the \$30M could more effectively be utilized to support community initiatives that would benefit the health and well-being of Indigenous communities
- Potential for linkage to food security or to enable Indigenous groups to determine priorities



Progress on implementation

Draft Terms of Reference developed for Oversight Committee

- Premier wrote Indigenous Leaders on April 8, 2019:
 - > outlined process to commence oversight committee
 - > transmitted TOR
 - > requested meeting to discuss how to move forward on physical mitigation and opportunities for community fund
