"Ms. Dalton was hired after an extensive search, coming to our province from Nova Scotia, where she was chair of their offshore petroleum board," said Ball. "At the time of her hire, we were hopeful that her extensive background in natural gas would kick start the Newfoundland and Labrador natural gas industry."

Ball noted that the sudden replacement of Ms. Dalton with Charles Bown, former Associate Deputy Minister of Energy and a key architect of the Muskrat Falls proposal, leaves many questions.
