"Government has worked on this legislation for months. It's troublesome that the Minister is giving incorrect information to the people of the province," said Ball. "The Minister has some explaining to do."

When asked why Emera, a publicly traded Nova Scotia company, is being given the right to expropriate land Natural Resources Minister Jerome Kennedy non-categorically stated that "Emera will not be expropriating land in our province." Government's proposed legislation states otherwise. Bill 60 in Section 2 (j) lists Emera as a proponent and Section 12 outlines that the proponent may expropriate land in our province.

In a follow up question about why Emera does not have to pay taxes, the Minister replied, "Also it is my understanding that Emera will pay taxes and that they are not excluded from paying taxes."

The briefing material provided by Nalcor clearly states, "The Act exempts the Proponents (including Emera) from municipal property, business and commercial taxes in transmission corridors and for transmission assets located on or connected to the corridor."

"Government is ramming this legislation through the House of Assembly and without proper due diligence," added Ball. "Clearly Government hasn't learned anything from the botched Abitibi file."
