I would also like to point out that the formation of the stable ice cover at el. 21.5m was a mother nature fortuity this year and something that we cannot rely on for next year. What happened was a large pan of ice broke away and become lodged roughly in the area that our ice boom is planned to be located. This had the effect of acting like the ice boom and creating conditions in the river that allowed the stable ice cover to form. Relying on another lice pan breaking away and becoming lodged in the same location next year would be highly unlikely and would not be supported by our ice experts as a prudent means of protecting the MF assets. Up stream water level is being held at 21.5 and we have a stable ice cover upstream. Downstream water levels have decreased to below ~5m (below the depth of the monitoring well). So the upstream ice cover has cut off supply of frazil ice as anticipated and ice risk has been effectively mitigated. Efforts continue relative to evaluating the plan to raise water levels to 25m upstream.
